

Nevada 83rd Legislative Session - Bill Summary by Issue Area

Criminal Justice and Civil Rights

AB 89 - Youth Search Restrictions

Limits unclothed searches of detained youth to extraordinary circumstances.

AB 123 - Threats in Political Campaigns

Criminalizes threats during campaigns causing reasonable fear.

AB 150 - Tribal Judge Protections

Grants same protections to tribal judges as public officers.

Education and Equity

AB 48 - School Transfer for Bullying

Allows perpetrator school transfer, prohibits victim/perpetrator being in same new school.

AB 153 - FAFSA and Tribal Judge Protections

FAFSA support for incarcerated students; tribal judge data protections.

Environmental Justice and Climate Resilience

AB 96 - Heat Mitigation Planning

Requires heat mitigation strategies in county master plans.

Health Care and Public Health

AB 25 - Healthcare for Incarcerated Women

Aligns care standards with national guidelines; expands ID verification; repeals regimental discipline.

AB 161 - Hospice Standards

Sets accreditation, training, oversight, and patient rights standards for hospice care.

AB 343 - Hospital Price Transparency

Aligns state law with federal hospital pricing transparency rules.

Housing Insecurity

AB 38 - Manufactured Housing Protections

Includes manufactured buildings, expands tenant rights, clarifies regulations for housing dealers.

AB 121 - Rental Transparency and Fee Caps

Mandates total rent disclosure, fee-free payment method, limits excessive charges.

AB 241 - Mixed-Use Zoning Reform

Mandates permits for multifamily developments in commercial zones.

AB 263 - Homeless Outreach in Clark County

Establishes outreach teams and cleanup coordination near public sites.

AB 366 - Supportive Housing Fund

Redesignates housing fund; secures fiscal year-end balances.

Legal Protections and Voting Rights

AB 220 - ID for Homeless

Provides free state ID cards to homeless individuals under specific conditions.

AB 367 - Language Access in Elections

Expands election language accessibility and oversight.
